

Michael's Magic Camp 2004

The Michael Scholz Memorial Charitable Fund held its second annual Magic Camp in July, 2004. Forty inner-city youth ages 8 through 12 participated in this educational, life-enhancing adventure at Crandon Park's Biscayne Nature Center.

As in 2003, the days were filled with Michael's Magic. Under the guidance of trained counselors and naturalists, the children learned about sea creatures and plants, marine mammals, and birds of South Florida. They participated in sea-grass adventures, hammock hikes, mangrove slogs, nature scavenger hunts, sea turtle sightings, arts and crafts and even their own talent show. In addition to a Biscayne Bay Boat tour and trip to the Key Biscayne Cape Florida Lighthouse, the youngsters were stimulated by lecturers and story tellers. Bruce Blitman, a certified court mediator, generously donated his time to introduce the children to conflict resolution techniques. *The camp will be held again in 2005* and provide an expanded program including workshops on honesty, integrity, and character building.

Shake-A-Leg
